

TOWN OF CONCORD TOWN BOARD
Work Session 6:30 p.m.

September 9, 2021

Supervisor Drake discussed the following topics with the Board:

1. On the agenda tonight is the MDA Consulting Engineers Contract for the Morton Road culvert emergency repair project. Their fee is \$27,500 for the whole project but only part of that fee will be paid this year; the balance will be billed next year when the construction process will begin.

Hwy Supt Edwards asked about advertising for this emergency road closing. Town Atty Attea said that advertising in the legal paper is not required. Hwy Supt Edwards will distribute a notice to the residents of Morton Road advising of the road closure and has advised the school district. Supervisor Drake thought this may be something that could be a CodeRed alert. The Highway Department will begin the project on Monday. Signs will be posted.

2. The Town has received the Notice to Proceed from Occhino Paving the Senior Center Parking lot; notified Marie Thorton from Erie County that the project is moving forward.

3. Also in tonight's packet is the list of CDBG eligible items and improvements for the Senior Center:

Architectural:

- masks, gloves, sanitizing spray for the fogger machine and cleaning products; approximate cost \$5,000.
- a permanent floor to ceiling divider and smaller point of use table dividers for the large meeting room. This would allow for greater separation of occupants; approximate cost \$40,000.
- a permanent, clear window or other divider which would separate the kitchen from the large meeting room; approximate cost \$10,000.

Mechanical:

- Filter sensors.
- Stand-alone filtration units for each of the rooms

4. There was discussion about Rails to Trails. The Planning Board discussed the ECRT at their last meeting and made a recommendation that the Town Board require ECRT to provide a SEQR. The recent vandalism at a neighboring home was discussed. Will the local police answer a call on the trail? Will the police go off road to chase? Supervisor Drake will reach out to Orchard Park for further discussion.
