

Supervisor Drozd discussed the following with the Board:

1. The elm tree at the Bensley Center is causing damage to the roof. Supervisor Drozd and Hwy Supt Edwards met with an arborist to evaluate the tree. If the tree were trimmed, it would be heavy on the back side. Based on the evaluation, it is best to cut the tree down. Supervisor Drozd showed the Board members pictures of the roof. The underlayment is lifting, shingles are sliding. There is also damage to the doorway. St. Matthew's Tree Service is scheduled to cut the tree down in the next few days.

The windows in the Town Hall are drafty. Supervisor Drozd met with a grant writer and is looking into historic grant money for get Town Hall windows and the Bensley Center door. The grant writer will also look into funding for playground equipment for Community Park. She will break down her proposals for each project; she would not be hired as an annual grant writer. More information will be provided when received.

2. Last month the Town received \$4,510 interest on the Reserve Account because of the change in banking; this is good news!

3. Supervisor Drozd attended the pre-construction meeting for the Kissing Bridge Sewer project. Supervisor Drozd showed the Board members pictures of the plant. The boring should start next week; the piping is here. Representatives from Kissing Bridge were also in attendance and involved in this meeting.

4. The new owner of 8934 Cattaraugus Street, Courtney Ebling, called to see about connecting to the Cattaraugus Street Water District. This parcel did not connect to the District at the time of installation. The current well did not pass Erie County Health Department testing. Supervisor Drozd met with David Sullivan, Village of Springville DPW, to review the situation. This parcel was on Village water prior to the Water District; the cut off curb box is still there but prior owner Lillie did not hook in. Ehmke Well Drillers drilled the well to this property and are looking for their paperwork. MDA Engineers are also looking in their files for documentation from the time the Water District was started. The meter pit is located right across the street from this house and the main line is on her side. Supervisor Drozd will work with all parties to find a resolution for Ms. Ebling.

5. On the Agenda tonight is the purchase of a new 10-wheel dump truck with an estimated 2026 delivery. This has been discussed previously. Hwy Supt Edwards and Supervisor Drozd met with representatives from Fleet Maintenance to discuss this purchase. The supply issues are making it difficult to purchase these vehicles. If the Town were to order now, the estimated delivery date for the truck would be 2026. There is currently money going into Reserves for this purchase and more will go in next year.
